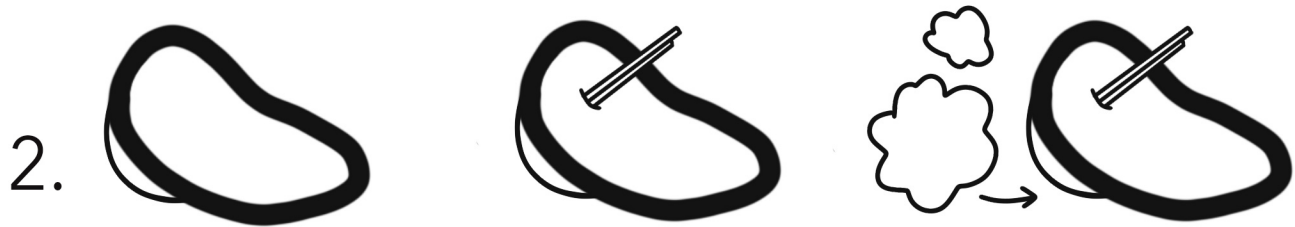
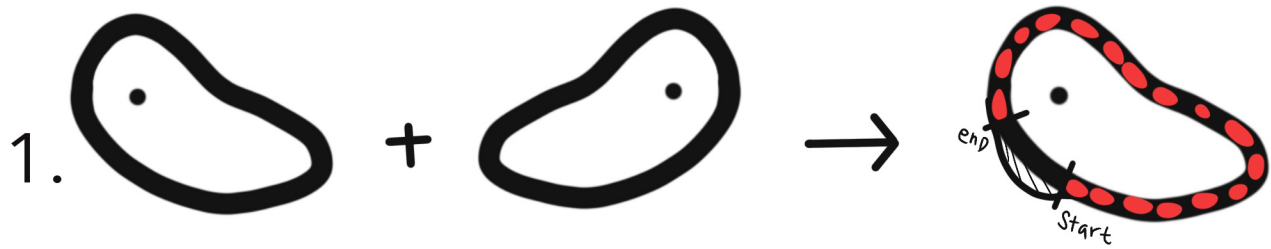
head

1. sew both parts to make the head with back stitches following the sewing line you created with your pen. (note: use the matching thread). After doing point 1, you will get two parts for making the head. Then, you need to sew them together.

2. sew them with back stitches following the picture above from the starting to the end point leaving some space not sewn. This space allows you to flip back from the inside.

3. After you flip back from the inside, fill the head with toy stuffing. Then, you can insert the cotter pin with the joint disc. Lastly, close the seam with ladder stitches.

4. You can start attaching the eyes and the nostrils (with small black seed beads). I recommend to attach them before closing the seam. However I always forget to attach it first :(



similar steps for the legs

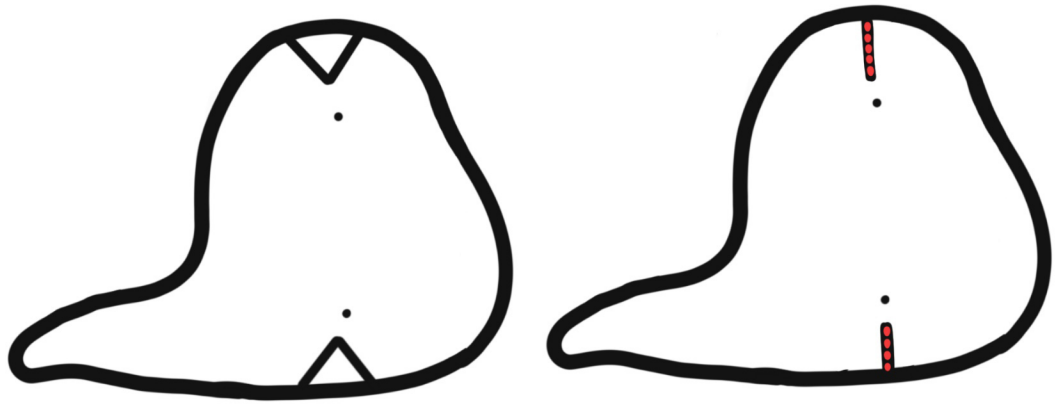
arms & legs

1. for each arm and leg, you will have two parts. You need to sew them with back stitches from the starting to the end point as illustrated above. This will leave some space that allows you to flip it back from the inside.

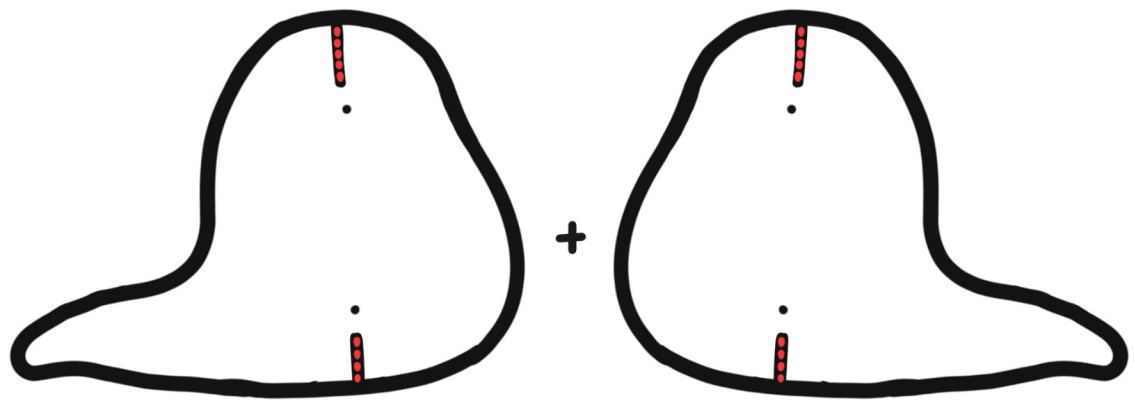
2. After you flip it back, insert the cotter pin and joint disc. Then fill the arms or legs with the toy stuffing.

Close the seam with the ladder stitches.

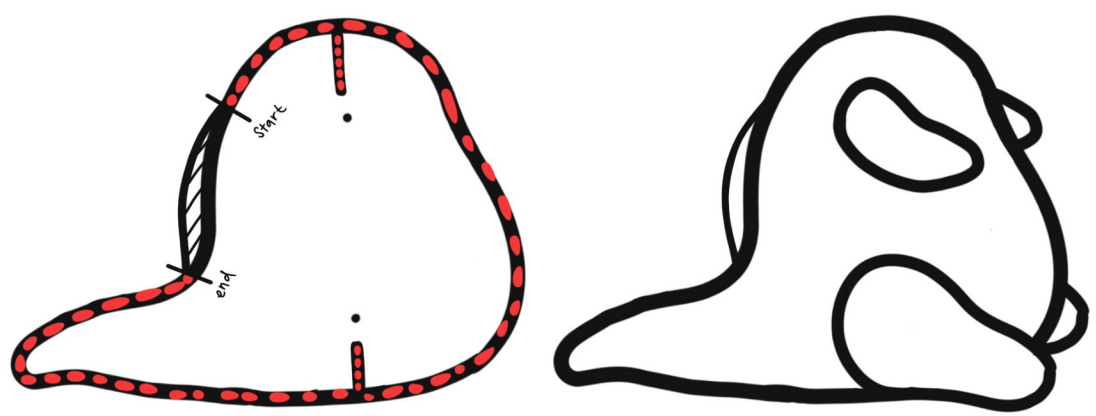

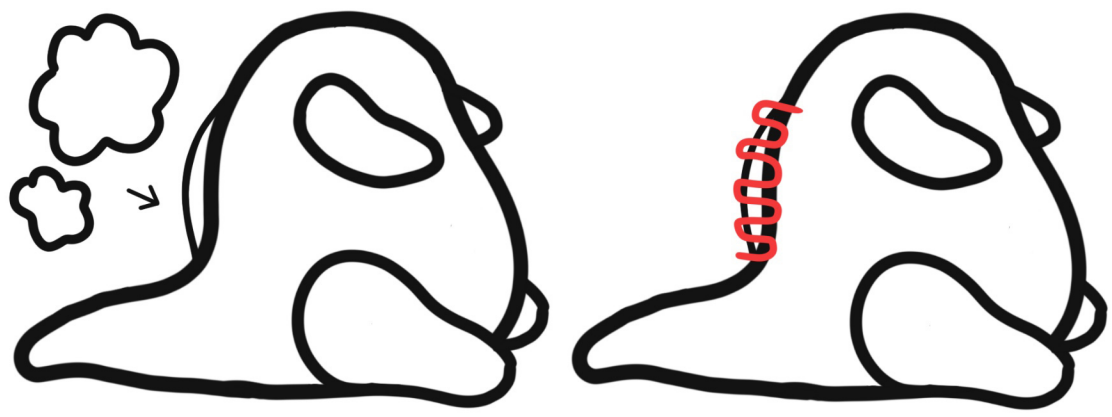

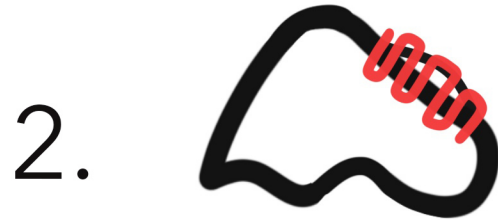

 back stitches
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body

1. sew the little triangles inside the pattern with back stitches.
2. after sew the triangles for both sides, let's sew the two parts together.
3. sew them with back stitches from the starting to end point as illustrated above. Then, flip it back. You can attach the head, legs and arms right in the dots created on the body.
4. After the cotter pins securely locked, you can fill the body with toy stuffing and close the seam with ladder stitches.



*similar steps for



wings

1. for each wing or ear, you will have two parts. You need to sew them with back stitches from the starting to the end point as illustrated above. This will leave some space that allows you to flip it back from the inside.

2. after you flip it back from the inside, you don't need to fill it with any toy stuffing. Just directly close the seam with ladder stitches.

3. directly attach them to the head and body as needed with ladder stitches. Don't forget to use the matching thread.

needle felting

After all is done, I coloured the centre of the body with core wools and felting needle. It magically works great on plush!

cotter pin & joint discs

You can make your own joint disc with shrink plastic. I draw circles ($d = 24\text{mm}$) and cut it. Next, I make holes right at the centre with a hole punch. Then, I shrink it with oven. However you can always purchase it online or at store:)
